Ludwig Van Beethoven

Ludwig Van Beethoven was a classical pianist and composer in the late eighteenth and early nineteenth century. Beethoven was born in Bonn, Germany in December 1770. His father and grandfather were musicians and wanted him to be a famous child musician like Mozart. When Beethoven was only five years old, his father taught him to play the piano, violin and viola. He played his first public performance when he was only seven.

Beethoven left school to study music when he was ten years old and composed his first piece of music two years later.
